Scott TD51 was made by Bruckman A. G. of Munich, Germany by the photo-etching process using a somewhat mutilated $5 \notin$ Washington/Franklin stamp design.

Stamps produced by line engraved intaglio and were likely testing feasibility of new types of inking-in rollers for multicolored intaglio stamps. Each strip has singlecolored stamps on ends, bicolored pair in center. Only red and blue strip is gummed; all others issued without gum. All fresh, MINT never hinged and scarce. Lot 1841 USA 1959 DUMMY STAMPS; SYLBEPONDORF TEST ENVELOPES A RARE and very fine group of three different covers created for mail testing on Aug 28, 1959. Two have vertical format grid 'stamps' to mimic then-current $4 \phi$ Lincoln (rubberstamped images), and one has horizontal format to mimic an airmail stamp, such as $7 \phi$ Jet. All three have Roman numeral ' V ' in address area. One cover bears Aug. 28, 1959, Sylbe-Pondorf machine cancel, also known from other live mail tests. Although specific nature of these tests is unknown, USPOD was experimenting with many different ways to speed mail processing for burgeoning mail volume. Booklet style format allows for imperf between pairs and center rows form tete-beche multiples. Very interesting exhibition piece, either as single items or broken down. Also first period in 'U.S.' missing on first and third, second period missing on second and fourth. Existing test stamps of this type have been locked in Goebel archives until bankruptcy decision in 2009 awarded materials to estates of several Goebel employee families. Remainder of archives were subsequently destroyed. Fewer than 150 examples are thought to exist in collector hands, and ONLY 6 block sets. ## Proposed Future DSSG Projects

## Updating Research Paper Number 3 - Dummy Stamp Booklets

Work is progressing, very much still at a snail's pace, on updating Research Paper Number 3 - Dummy Stamp Booklets. The last update by Earl McAfee, Dummy Booklets Study Group Chairman, was in 1998. Since then there have been many new discoveries. Many of them have been written up in articles in The United States Specialist. Now the time has come to document and illustrate them in a new updated version of Research Paper Number 3. I am in charge of this update project and knowing that it will
take quite a bit of time to complete, have no estimated completion date in mind. I will be asking all of you to join me in this project as I am not able to do it all, nor would you want me to do it all. It is a DSSG project and all members should have a chance to provide their input. Several illustrations are needed and a listing of these will be sent to you when I compile it. Scans at 300 dpi are necessary for clarity. It is anticipated that this publication will be in color. It has not yet been determined if it will be available on CD.

## The Other Projects

There are several other projects currently being worked on by various members of the DSSG. They are as follows:

- Compiling a complete and comprehensive list of dummy test stamp roll sizes, box and roll labels. There are many different styles of labels sometimes found on the same test stamps. This is especially true of Bureau of Engraving and Printing products
- Compiling a complete and comprehensive record of auction appearances and prices


## 2012 Durland Standard Plate Number Catalog

The 2012 edition of the Durland Standard Plate Number Catalog is now available. The USSS introduced the book at the Society's annual meeting at NAPEX in June of 2012. Like the 2008 edition, the new Durland has an all-color presentation, with a three column $81 / 2$ " $\times 11$ " format that is available both perfect and spiral bound. The large size makes the catalog easier to handle as the number of postage
stamps and back of the book listings continue to grow. The spiral bound version has the advantage of lying flat when open. All of the illustrations have been created in digital format that will produce high-quality printed images, and there are illustrations on nearly every page.

The new 2012 Durland is the most comprehensive research source for plate number information on

United States postage, special service, revenue stamps and other back of the book stamps listed in the Scott Specialized Catalog. The new edition includes plate number information for the last four years of new issues along with scores of previously unreported numbers for pre-Bureau and back of the book issues. The catalog also includes plate number information on Confederate issues, overprinted Possessions postage, Carriers, and WW II American Military Government stamps and is the most comprehensive reference for marginal markings.

The catalog lists and prices Bureau precancel plate blocks for the first time, including the experimental precancels of 1916, examples of which are illustrated. The Beer stamp section is greatly expanded on the
basis of recent discoveries of proofs and Bureau records. The taxpaid revenue section is also greatly expanded. The 2012 edition was formatted and digitized by Len Piszkiewicz and edited by W. Wallace Cleland.

The Durland 2012 edition is available for $\$ 26$, perfect-bound, and $\$ 28$, spiral-bound. USSS members will receive discount pricing of $\$ 21$ perfect-bound and $\$ 23$ spiral-bound.
