CORRECTION! ON SHL #66 the labels designating two of the positions of the 4¢ 1898 (#280) were reversed. Please correct your copy by reversing positions 8 and 41.

NOTE: FRANK REEDER Jr. calls attention to misleading information on SHL #58, relative to the "gash" on the TAG of POSTAGE on the 13¢ of 1908. This variety has been known for many years and was or is listed in Gibbons' catalogue. It comes from position 96 of a lower pane of plate 4948; probably the lower right. It is illustrated in King & Johl, vol. I, and should be listed in Scott's S.U.S. catalogue.

At the left is a beautiful Twisted Transfer on the le sidewise coil #597, reported by BEV KING in Scott's Journal (March 1933) as having been found by L. D. SHOEMAKER. Solid lines indicate the displaced design, while dotted lines indicate the position of the transfer before erasure.


