
The first letter which dealt with the Black Jacks was purely from a per-sonal standpoint as these are a favorite with a lot of collectors. I notice that in S.H.L. No. 3 (page 2) dated 9-23-29 C.W. stated, "I am told that there are over 40 shifts on the 2¢ Black Jack. I have six. Has any one ever seen a pub-lished description of them?" It is quite evident from his workbook which was current at the time of his demise that this number had increased from 6 to 12 and a further check by the writer disclosed more in his vast collection.
