Chapter 26

Plate Numbers 19000-19999

Plate number 19000 was assigned to the 10c Lindbergh air mail stamp in June, 1927 and 19999 was assigned to the 2c Washington regular issue stamp in February, 1930. The rate of plate usage has now slowed dramatically since the rotary press plates seem to be able to print many times more impressions than the flat press plates. The impressions from flat plates rarely exceeded 40,000 while it is not uncommon to see more than 500,000 impressions from a rotary plate. The change was due to chrome plating of the rotary plates. Consequently, only 702 of the 1000 plates were assigned to the 4th Bureau series. There were 116 commemoratives and 140 air mail plates assigned, plus 42 plates assigned to other types of stamps.

633 plates of the 4th Bureau series went to press in this section. 23 of these, all coils, are unreported. But collectors seem to be finding more and more of these coils and they are also becoming adept at finding the rotary press booklets with partial plate numbers. The 2c Washington stamp is the most difficult because some of the rotary plates did have short runs. Plate 19424 is probably the most difficult. The 2c Washington Die II variety made a short appearance in this section. Six sheet plates were used and, while the stamp is expensive, the plates are common. There are 9 Die II coil plate and 3 are unreported. These items are scarce and expensive. Die I coil plate 19515 and Die II plate 19748 were at press together so a line pair showing either plate number might be a combination of both dies. This is a very desirable plate number piece to own and is quite scarce. All of the 48 2c booklet plates are easy - it is just those coil and booklets that make a high completion percentage really tough. Locating 450 of the 633 plates would be a real accomplishment.

Commemoratives are starting to become a major player in these sections of plate numbers. 10 designs are in the 19000 section with 116 plates assigned. Most of these plates are quite common with one notable exception and that is the first commemorative stamp issued in coil form. 8 Edison coil plates went to press and these range from scarce to rare. The 2c Clark stamp was a bicolor issue and there were 12 frame and 12 center plates. Combination collectors had fun with this one with 144 combinations and a total of 288 positions to locate.

History was made in the air mail stamps with the introduction of the first commemorative booklet. Four flat plates went to press to print the Lindbergh stamp in booklet form. The plate number arrangement on these stamps was similar to rotary plates so plate numbers appeared only on panes that were somewhat miscut. Partial plate numbers on these panes are quite scarce. The 5c beacon air mail had all of its plates assigned and used in this section. 55 frame plates and 43 center plates went to press. The four center plates 19636-7-8-9 each produced only 100 impressions. Only 19639 is reported. The Durland catalog says over 1000 plate combinations have been

reported. The expense of the plate blocks would deter most collectors from attempting to collect combinations of this fascinating stamp.

The 10c, 15, and 20c special handling stamps were issued and had four plates each. These plates had a long life and dry printings were made in the 1950s of these stamps. The 2c postage due stamp had 8 plates to press and some of these are tough. Four 5c dues went to press and these plates are hard to find. Four plates were used to print the 30c due and each plate printed only 500 impressions. Copies were found but these plates are still hard to locate.

The totals for the 19000 section show 894 plates to press with 26 unreported. The 4th Bureau series coils and booklets provide most of the challenge for the collector. This is a fascinating series with much variety. Overprints on the 2c Washington produced the Molly Pitcher and Hawaii commemoratives and some of the 4th Bureau plates participated in the Kansas and Nebraska overprint experiment. A high percentage of completion of these plates is really difficult but a good starting goal would be 700 plates which can be done. More thrills await with the 20000 section of plate numbers which we will next check out.




