## Delay in the 2025 Scott Specialized Catalogue of United States Stamps & Covers

Every April for many years now, we have been fortunate to have the opportunity to meet at WESTPEX with Jim Kloetzel, Editor Emeritus of the Scott Specialized Catalogue. We make up a comprehensive list of new test stamps that we feel should be listed in the following year's catalogue, along with corrections and revisions to make the listings easier to use.

The Scott Publishing Company usually has the new Scott Specialized Catalogue of United States Stamps & Covers printed and released around the beginning of October of each year. However, that wasn't the case in 2024. The 2025 Scott Specialized Catalogue was subject to several delays and was not released in October as usual. Without a copy of the printed catalogue that we usually have in our hands by the middle of October, we didn't know how (or if) we were going to make our usual list.

On December 2, 2024, the Linn's and Scott Team sent this letter regarding the delay in the Scott Specialized Catalogue: *"Earlier this year, a business dispute arose between Amos Media (Linn's and Scott Catalogues parent company) and our contracted printing partner responsible for producing our coin and stamp publications. Despite repeated efforts to resolve the matter swiftly, the situation persisted for several months. Please know that this was never an attempt to alter the delivery methods of Scott Stamp Monthly or the Scott Catalogues."*

*Throughout this period, our top priority was to restore printing and delivery of the Monthly, and USS and Classic catalogues.*

*In the meantime, these products were made available in digital format to ensure uninterrupted access for our subscribers. We are pleased to announce that the Scott Specialized and Classic catalogues will be mailed sometime in January and February 2025."* As it turned out, the 2025 print catalogue wasn't actually delivered until March 2025.
























Since the catalogue was released so late, Jay Bigalke (Editor-in-Chief) made two different versions of the 2025 Scott Specialized Catalogue available to us for our use in preparing for our meeting with Jim Kloetzel at WESTPEX.

One of the versions we received was a set of scans of pages 832 - 853 from the 2025 Scott Specialized Catalogue. These 21 pages of test stamp listings had three columns per page; a sample page is shown on page 2.

We also received a link to Scott's On-Line Digital Catalog that contains 58 pages of test stamps listings in three different sections. While the text is the same in both versions, the digital on-line catalog's font is larger than in the print catalog; furthermore, the images are 75% larger in the on-line catalog. A second reason there were twice as many pages in the Digital On-Line listings is because those pages have two columns per page rather than the three columns found in the print catalog. A sample page is shown on page 3.

The first section includes listings of coil and sheet test stamps; it contains 23 pages and has a few additional images not found in the print version of the catalog. The second section contains 22 pages of listings for test booklets, panes and covers. The third section has 3 pages of listings for Test Stamp Essays, Trial Color and Die Proofs.

We were asked to use the On-Line pages to make our changes. With the 2-column pages and the larger images, we were able to put our suggestions directly on the digital on-line pages to show what and where we wished to make a change. We made a couple supplemental "-A" and "-B" pages for new or additional information that we wanted to present that did not fit on the digital online 2-column pages. While it was much easier to make notes directly on the pages, we also made our usual list of proposed changes.

Unfortunately, due to health reasons, Mike Perry was unable to make the trip to WESTPEX meet with Jim Kloetzel. So, Terry Scott met with Jim and his wife Karolyn and had a wonderful meeting; Jim was happy to see how we presented suggested changes to the existing Digital On-Line 2-column pages.

Both the paper and digital catalogs are available from Amos Publishing. Scott charges \$109.99 for the digital catalog - the paper print catalog costs \$111.99. [amosadvantage.com](http://amosadvantage.com)

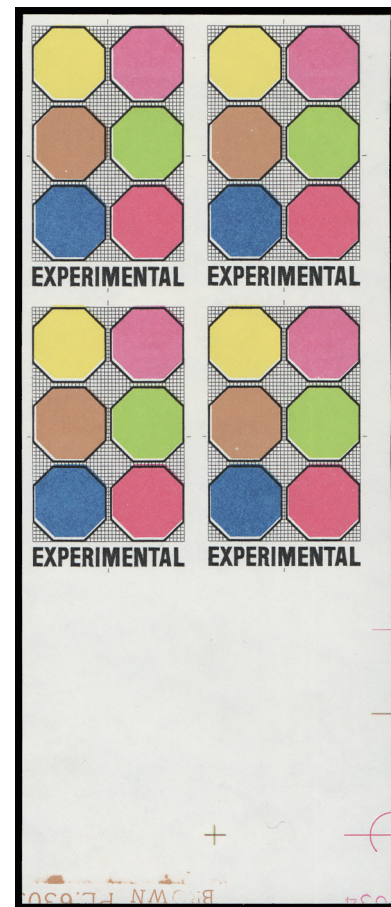

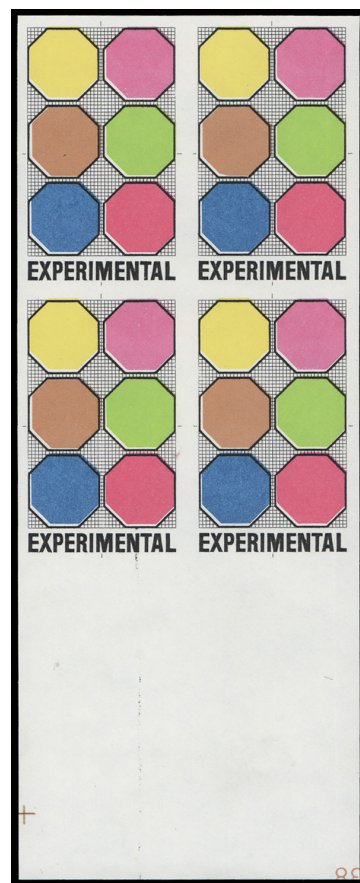


